Too often decisions are made in a vacuum, resulting in confusion and frustration by those charged with carrying out the intended change. We will focus on the key considerations in developing collaborative structures school-wide that allow everyone to be focused on and committed to a common effort.

Resistance is often due to not fully understanding the direction a school is heading or the intentions of those we work with. We will dig into the unique attributes each member of a team brings to the table, and consider how to better lean into these strengths to operate as a highly functioning team.




